THE AFRICAN NATIONAL CONGRESS (ANC) V UMKHONTO WESIZWE (MK) PARTY, 27 MARCH 2024, DURBAN HIGH COURT

The matter of the African National Congress (ANC) v Umkhonto weSizwe (MK) Party (Case number: D153/2024) is set down to be heard in open court in the KwaZulu-Natal Division of the High Court, Durban, on 27 March 2024.

Due to the limited space in the court room the following with regards to the media will apply:

- 1. **NO video** or TV cameras will be allowed inside the court room;
- 2. **15 members** of the media can be accommodated in the court room this includes reporters (scribes) and photographers; and
- 3. **NO photographs** may be taken when the court is in session.

Media access to the venue will be by accreditation only. Members of the media interested in covering the proceedings are requested to apply for accreditation by submitting their details using the template provided here - https://www.judiciary.org.za/index.php/news/media-accreditation - to Ms Zininzi Nonjinge at ZNonjinge@judiciary.org.za and CC LNtuli@judiciary.org.za by no later than 12h00 on Tuesday, 26 March 2024. Accreditation applications not submitted using the provided template will not be considered. Personal information will be processed in line with the Protection of Personal Information Act (Act No. 4 of 2013).

Accreditation cards will be distributed to approved applicants. This will be communicated via email once accreditation has been finalised.

The South African National Editors Forum (SANEF) and the Foreign Correspondents Association (FCA) are kindly requested to co-ordinate and submit names of photographers who will form a pool for, and provide pictures to the media.
